Student membership is offered at a significant discount; however, there are many benefits. Check out the various <u>divisions</u> within APA to better understand the diversity of the field of psychology.

The <u>Association for Psychological Science</u> is another popular and useful association to join. Many associations have student membership rates. Although the rate is significantly discounted, student members receive many of the same benefits as regular members.

<u>Psi Chi, the International Honor Society in Psychology</u>, provides outstanding psychology students an opportunity to network and to recognize individual scholarship. UMGC was granted a chapter in May 2007. Student leaders and faculty advisors work together to provide additional learning and informational sessions in Adelphi, Maryland; Asia; and Europe. Membership is restricted, and students must be invited to join.

<u>Pi Gamma Mu, the International Honor Society in Social Sciences</u>, is another honor society available to outstanding students within the social sciences. UMGC also has a chapter that students can be invited to join.
